

# Legal Shots

Possibility of partial cumulation of unemployment subsidy with salary.

Beneficiaries who have been receiving unemployment benefit for more than 12 months qualify as 'long-term unemployed'

An exceptional measure to encourage long-term unemployed people to return to work has been approved, allowing them to partially combine unemployment benefit with salary after 12 months of receiving unemployment subsidy, provided that the following conditions are met:

- a) Beneficiaries accept a job offer presented by the Employment and Professional Training Institute or obtain a placement by their own means with the conclusion of a full-time employment contract in one of the following modalities: (i) indefinite term employment contract; (ii) fixed term employment contract with an initial duration equal to or greater than 12 months; or (iii) term employment contract for an unspecified duration provided that the foreseeable duration is equal to or greater than 12 months.
- b) Salary is equal to or inferior to the 'reference salary' for unemployment subsidy.
