Unemployment subsidy extended to victims of domestic violence

Termination of the employment contract by an employee with the status of victim of domestic violence will be considered 'involuntary unemployment'.

Access to unemployment subsidy is extended to victims of domestic violence who have this status recognized by the judicial authorities or the competent criminal police entities.

To this end, it is now stipulated that:

- Termination of the employment contract by an employee with the status of victim of domestic violence will be considered 'involuntary unemployment'.
- For self-employed workers who are economically dependent, the concept of 'involuntary termination of contract' includes the termination of service contracts on the initiative of these beneficiaries if they have the status of victim of domestic violence.
- As for self-employed workers with business activity and member of statutory boards, 'involuntary termination of professional activity' now includes the termination of professional activity on the initiative of these beneficiaries if they have the status of victim of domestic violence.
