Amendment to the Statute for Informal Carers

Non-primary informal carer status is extended to parents with shared custody

The status of non-primary informal carer has been extended to include:

- all people who, even if they have no family ties with the person being cared for, live in the person's home and accompany and care for them on a regular but not permanent basis, regardless of whether they receive remuneration from their professional activity or for caring for the person being cared for;
- parents with shared custody, who can now both be considered non-main informal carers.

This is the first amendment to the Informal Carer Statute.
